





Northern Lights

A few days ago – November 13 to be exact, heliocentric Venus was on the opposite side of the Sun from heliocentric Mercury. These two planets were each exerting gravitational torque on the surface layers of the Sun. This force caused an increase in particle emissions from the Sun. The result - where I live in western Canada- was the northern lights being visible at 9pm at night. The northern lights are solar wind particles hitting the Earth's upper atmosphere. According to the astronomer – mathematicians that I follow (Scafetta, Tattersall, et al), this event should have induced a change in human emotion. And it did! The E-mini S&P 500 futures opened at 6873 and closed at 6760 for a net loss of 113 points.

And this is the focus of the 2026 *Almanac*. We are emotionally linked to heliocentric events in the solar system. Disturbances to our emotions will cause volatility in our buying and selling on the markets.

George Bayer – a new look...

In the 2026 Almanac, I am including a chapter on George Bayer's rules. I review some of his more important rules with examples. As I was getting ready to type the paragraphs pertaining to Rule 10-A and Rule 9-A, the possibility occurred to me that maybe, just maybe, these two Rules should be interpreted from a *heliocentric* point of view. In past issues of this newsletter, I have used a geocentric approach which was accurate until Mars or Venus turned retrograde.

Let's take a look at Rule 10-A. But first – a review of the basis for these Rules: In the heliocentric approach to planetary movement, the position of a planet in space can be defined by declination and Hours of Right Ascension (R.A.). There are 24 hours of R.A. time in the zodiac wheel. To convert a planet's degree location to R.A. time, one must divide by 15.

Suppose the planet Mars is located at 15 degrees of the sign of Scorpio. In other words, Mars is at 225 degrees in the zodiac wheel. Dividing 225 degrees by 15 gives 15 Hours of R.A. time.

Bayer's Rule 10-A then says to add 1.625 hours and convert back to degrees by multiplying by 15.

15 hours of R.A. + 1.625 = 16.625. Multiplying this by 15 gives 249.37 degrees. One will then have to look ahead in time to see when Mars will be passing 9.37 degrees of Sagittarius. This time should align to some kind of a price reaction on the stock, index, or commodity futures contract being studied.

As one example, the following is a chart of daily **Copper** futures prices. Starting from the April 2025 sell-off, I have repeatedly applied Rule 10-A.



In some cases, the intervals align to small price reactions; in other cases, to steeper reactions. Through it all, one must use trend indicator such as the Slow Stochastic.

The following is a chart of **Live Cattle** futures. Starting from the April 2025 sell-off, I have repeatedly applied Rule 10-A.



In some cases, the intervals align to small price reactions; in other cases, to steeper reactions. In particular, note the Jul 27 interval which does not appear to be any reaction at all. In fact, this interval falls exactly on the geocentric mean of the bullish move from July to late August. Recall that we are accustomed to taking the mean between two numbers as being their sum divided by 2 as in the formula $\text{mean} = ((a + b)/2)$. The geocentric mean is calculated as the square root of the multiplication of the two numbers as in the formula: $\text{geocentric mean} = \sqrt{(a \times b)}$. Time and time again I see planetary events aligning to geocentric means. I cannot explain why this is. A cosmic mystery....

Now, what if we were to just focus on significant trend pivot points? The following daily chart of electronic stock trading platform **WE BULL** (ticker BULL) shows the result.



- From a pivot point in mid-June, the first Mars interval takes us to early August and another swing pivot.
- From a swing high in July, a Mars interval takes us to a small pivot low in September.
- From a swing low in early August, a Mars interval takes us to a more substantive pivot low in September.
- From the swing high in late September a Mars interval takes us to November 11 when the stock took a dive lower.

I will wrap this Nov 16 issue with a look at BitCoin and at the S&P 500.



From a pivot point in mid-July, a Bayer Rule 10-A Mars interval takes us to a swing point in early September.

From the pivot point in mid-August, a Bayer Rule 10-A Mars interval takes us to just a couple days past a swing point in late September.

From the significant high in early October, a Bayer Rule 10-A Mars interval takes us to what will be some kind of a swing point around **Nov 20th**.

From the significant high on October 28th, a Bayer Rule 10-A Mars interval takes us to what will be some kind of a swing point around **Dec 9th**.



Application of Rule 10-A to the S&P 500 suggests that **Nov 23 and Dec 11** are two dates to watch closely going forward.

November 23 will have Saturn at a benign 60-degrees to Earth and Saturn 90-degrees to Mercury.

December 10-12 will be a bit more active and will have Saturn 120-degrees to Venus, Mercury 90-degrees square Venus, and Mercury 180-degrees opposite Saturn.

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
